#### Why do bad things happen to good people?

The Bible says that we have an adversary in the devil who only comes to steal, kill and destroy. Revelations 12 tells us that the devil is dermis to wage war against us.

#### Will God answer all of my prayers?

James 4:2-3 tells us that we lust for things that we don't have and we kill and desire to have but still haven't obtained: we fight and war but we have not because we ask not; and when we do ask we have a tendency to ask for this that we want but that have no value to God or His kingdom.

1 John 5:14-15 explains the confidence that we should have in God; that is we ask anything according to his will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we will have the requests that we have asked of Him.

#### Is tithing still required?

According to scripture tithing was a requirement in the Old Testament for the people of Israel.

The new testament doesn't seem to require tithing. A requirement to tithe would be a law. In this new testament dispensation we are under grace, not the law.

However, joyful and abundant giving is required and is not limited to money. Give the best that you can with through prayer and obedience and only to support the work of the ministry, not the life of the minister.

Paul says, in 2 Corinthians 5:12, that if the willingness is there, that the gift (giving) is acceptable based on what the giver has, not what the y don't have.

#### How do I know if I'm actually saved?

Ephesians 2:8-10 tells us that salvation is a free gift received by grace through faith and Romans 11:29 tells us that the gifts and callings of God do not expire or get recalled.

Therefore, salvation will not be taken at from you, but what you do with it is up to you and is what you will be judged on.

#### Do I have to go to a traditional church?

No, but in Paul's letter to the *Hebrews, chapter 10 verse 25*, he admonishes believers to assemble together regularly to encourage one another.

If you are the only Christian in the room then you are exactly where God wants you. That's what discipleship is all about. Not always talking and answering questions and participating in debates, but as the only believer in your circle your life, as it changes, will be the best discipleship tool you'll ever have.

#### What if no one around me is saved?

If you are the only Christian in the room then you are exactly where God wants you. That's what discipleship is all about. Not always talking and answering questions and participating in debates, but as the only believer in your circle your life, as it changes, will be the best discipleship tool you'll ever have.

#### What if I've done bad things?

Paul used to murder Christians before writing most of the new testament and according to the Bible David, though he acted for a time as an adulterer, murderer, liar, manipulator and deceiver, was "a man after God's own heart".

#### What if I'm struggling with bad habits?

That's normal. We are instructed to fight the good fight and be transformed by the renewing of our mind. Fighting, transformation and renewal are all actions of effort over time.

Be consistent, stay the course and endure.

#### What books or influencers do you recommend for growth?

The Bible. Proverbs, the book of wisdom, has 31 chapters, one for each day of the month. I recommend reading the chapter that corresponds with the current day of the month. (Chapter 1 on the first, chapter 2 on the second, chapter 15 on the fifteenth, and so on)

This is a good way to develop a personal devotional time, begin your own self paced Bible study and get used to reading your Bible and meditating on the Word day and night.

#### No one understands what I'm going through?

Hebrews 4:15 informs us that Jesus can relate to our feelings of weakness, despair and anguish because He was tempted in every way that we were and yet he never committed a sin.

#### Will God accept me like I am or do I need to get clean first?

Do you wait to feel better before going to the hospital? Jesus spent time with those who most people looked over and ignored and said that he did not come for the righteous but sinners to repentance. Besides, Jesus loves cleaning us up.

#### I just got saved, now what?

Spend as much time as you can praying, reading the word and meditating on what you read. Build up your relationship with God and learn to hear His voice.

#### What does it mean is to be a Christian?

By definition, Christian is defined as one who follows the teachings and examples of Christ, and therefore Christianity is the accepted, adopted and authorized practices of collective Christians. (ye shall know them by their fruits). So then, how do we follow Jesus if He isn't first in line and or if we don't go the same way that He is going? **Jesus Must be First!** And His teachings, commandments and examples must be our guide. (When on a unknown path, you go where your guide tells you to. {His word is a lamp into our feet and a light until our path})

Therefore, to be a Christian one must first be: **Surrendered, Submitted, Saved and Sanctified** | (Mathew 22:36-40)

1. Love the LORD God with all. 2. Love your neighbor as yourself.

Luke 23:39-43 - Why did Jesus save the thief?

1. He surrendered & submitted to Him as Lord. 2. He saw himself as the other thief(neighbor).

Paul's letter to the Philippians confirms this -

Chapter 1 - Paul surrenders to his circumstances, finds the good in his situation and understands it's about God's overall plan and not his comfort, happiness or success.

Chapter 2 - Paul admonishes us to submit (bring our will under subjection to Christ) by humbling ourselves, holding fast to the word of life (Christ's teachings) above all else, and help others.

Chapter 3 - Paul explains that by identifying as a Christian first, and placing our confidence in Christ rather than in the 7 identifying-markers (dung) of humanity, that we avoid the dog/dung dilemma by using our accomplishments (dung) as fertilizer to grow our ministry rather than feasting on them (as dogs do) to feed our ego.

Chapter 4 - Paul clearly instructs us to look after one another, to be satisfied with what we have and to desire to have more of the things that would allow us to be better Christians. He explains that we can be satisfied with what God has given us of Himself, and still desire more of Him, because of our relationship with His Son our Lord, Jesus Christ.

The thief on the cross did all four of these things in one statement.

- 1. "Lord" he Surrendered to His authority.
- 2. "remember me when you enter you kingdom" he Submitted to His power.
- 3. Jesus Saved him because he confessed Him as Lord.
- 4. "this day you will be With Me in paradise" to be sanctified means 'to set apart', Jesus set the thief apart by saying he would be With Him, the thief was declared to be Jesus' "special guest".

#### Salvation = confessions with the mouth. Belief in resurrection = righteousness. [Romans 10:8-10]

There's no proof that the thief on the cross knew about or believed in the resurrection. But there Is proof that he confessed Jesus as Lord.

Jesus' Death redeemed us and paid for our sins, His Burial covered up any evidence of our sins and His Resurrection allows for mercy as God sees us through (covered with) His blood.

#### What does it mean to forgive and to be forgiven?

Biblical forgiveness is less connected to excusing ones behavior and more connected to a lender canceling a debt. When a financial institution (the Bible says "the wages of sin is death" and 'wages' are a financial term, so financial rules apply) cancels a debt it is done in writing and legally prohibits the lender from any rights or authority to sell future restitution.

Sin, according to scripture and within this context, is willful participation in a prohibition. Committing a sin and living in sin are not viewed as the same thing and hold different penalties. I'm the financial world, true debt forgiveness has no impact on credit. The debt is simply erased as if it never existed. In this case, you can still apply for and use credit, even with the same lender, because there is no evidence of a judgment.

However, partial debt forgiveness removes the payment owed but is often accompanied by a negative hit to one's credit score and there maybe be evidence of the judgment on permanent records for other lenders to see.

The later is the result of living in sin. Evidence remains because the behavior continued until consequences occurred.

However, in the financial, full debt forgiveness is still possibly even after a partial judgment but it requires a minimal period of seven years where the remaining debt is paid off and a new application for forgiveness is submitted.

This 7 year period is when restitution is made. Paying the remaining debt is in essence compensation for damages. Though restitution is not a uniquely financial word (it's more often thought of in a criminal sense), the concept of "making it right" is at the heart of the credit scoring system.

This is what the Bible calls restoration. A process of specific actions over time that brings about complete and absolute wholeness.

Therefore, forgiveness is Christ paying our debt for us so that the Lender of Life receives back what He is due for the loan (our life).

We pray (speak to God) in the name of Jesus because He paid our balance and purchased our debt so our account is now with Christ and, just like with any other bank, if we want to deposit into (God) we must deposit a check (request/prayer) that is written on a recognized note that is pre-authorized to conduct business on my behalf.

God recognizes the name holding the account (Jesus), not the name of the account holder.

<u>To forgive others is to therefore</u>: delete any evidence of payments due and to validate the account as in good standing, with a zero balance, and with no negative impact to their credit score which will allow them to continue to apply for and receive credit, goods and services, at the level they previously did.

With this understanding we now know that it is impossible to truly forgive without forgetting. To remember is to 'hold on to'. To 'let go' is to forget; like forgetting the debt owed to us.

According to The Lord's Prayer, God will forgive us to the level we forgive others. And we will be judged based on how we judge others.

#### What denomination is Yieldcamp?

Yieldcamp is an environmental stewardship and holistic health nonprofit, rooted in Christian values and biblical principles, functioning as a non-denominational outreach ministry, operating in alignment with the philosophies of the Christian mendicant order, and executing God's will through the itinerant servant model (ISM)

Mendicant orders were founded primarily to address the spiritual needs of growing urban populations by combining a life of poverty and begging with active preaching and ministry.



They were a direct response to the increasing wealth of the Church, which made many feel distant from the clergy, and arose as a way to live a life of radical poverty similar to that of Jesus. Key reasons for their founding include evangelizing the urban masses, providing religious instruction, and serving the poor and sick in newly developed cities.

#### Key reasons for their founding

- **Urban evangelization:** Mendicant orders were designed to serve the rapidly growing urban populations that were often too large for parish churches to adequately support. They traveled to cities to preach, administer sacraments, and help people live a more spiritual life.
- Emulating radical poverty: They were founded by individuals like St. Francis and St. Dominic to embrace a life of extreme poverty, renouncing personal and communal possessions like land and fixed income, and relying on public charity for survival. This was seen as a way to more closely imitate Jesus.

St. Francis of Assisi (1181/1182–
1226) was an Italian friar, poet, and mystic who founded the Franciscan Order after a spiritual conversion in his youth. He renounced his wealthy background to live a life of poverty, preaching repentance and love, and is known for his deep connection to nature, for which he is the patron saint of ecology. St. Francis is also recognized for re-

#### Life and conversion

Catholic Church.

 Born Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone into a wealthy family, he lived a carefree youth until illness and captivity during a military expedition led to a profound spiritual awakening.

- He began to reject his luxurious life and eventually gave up all his worldly possessions to live in poverty and serve the poor.
- A pivotal moment was when he heard a voice from a crucifix in the church of San Damiano instructing him to "repair my church," which he initially took literally by rebuilding the church stone by stone.

Franciscan "monks" are actually friars, members of religious orders like the Order of Friars Minor, founded by St. Francis of Assisi in 1209. Unlike cloistered



monks who live in isolation, friars are mendicant (begging) brothers and priests who live among the laity, serve society, and support themselves through donations, focusing on vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. Their way of life emphasizes charity, humility, and a love for all creation, with the motto "Pax et bonum" (Peace and all good).

#### Who they are and what they do

- Religious orders: The Franciscans are a large group of related organizations within the Catholic Church, including the First Order (for men), the Second Order (for nuns in the Order of Saint Clare), and the Third Order (for male and female lay members).
- Mendicant lifestyle: They are distinguished from monks by their focus on serving society rather than living in a cloistered, self-sufficient community. Friars move between different houses in their province and work directly with the public.






